### Penguin & Starfish

Let's explore our country! From Banwell to Bristol and beyond in Penguin and Starfish classes we will be learning about the United Kingdom. Reception children will be learning about our local community, including people who help us at school and in the wider community. We will consider where we live, where we have visited and where we might be going in the summer holidays.

For our KS1 children we will be developing our geographical knowledge and skills and will learn about the four countries of the United Kingdon and their capital cities. We will become familiar the vocabulary used to identify human and physical geography (for example village, town, city and beach, cliff, hill and mountain) through stories, non fiction texts, maps and our own experiences. We will compare the village of Banwell to a town and a city. The highlight of the term will no doubt be our trip to Bristol Zoo Project where we can practice using maps to find our way around and notice the landscape as we travel to Bristol.

We have thoroughly enjoyed receiving postcards from your friends and family from Scotland to China and many places in between! Thank you for supporting us with that. Please keep the postcards coming – if you have any days out planned during half term you might like to encourage your child to write a postcard to bring in next term to tell their friends about it.

# Dolphin

In term 6, Dolphins will be learning about money, shape, and statistics. In English, we will be writing instructions and narratives based on 'The Barefoot Book of Earth Tales' by Dawn Casey. In Science, we will learn all about electricity. In Opening Worlds, we are learning about Cordoba: City of Light in History, Deserts in Geography and Ramadan in RE. In DT, we will be embroidering textiles. In French, we will be relearning the story of Goldilocks in French! In PSHE, we will be covering changing me. In PE, we will be learning about different multi-sports and cricket. In Music we are continuing our Recorder journey, learning to play the song 'Enchanted Forest'.





#### Sea Lion

In term 6 Sea Lions will be continuing with our Djembe drumming lessons and hope to be able to put on a small concert for our parents towards the end of term. We are also going on a trip to We the Curious to investigate all things science. We will be learning more about coding in computing and investigating Electricity.

In our design and technology lessons we will be learning all about construction.

We will be studying Norse mythology in our English lesson after we have finished our work on The Lady of Shalott.

#### Shark

This term, we will be preparing our Year 6 pupils for their transition to secondary school. Each student will take part in transition days tailored to their future schools, helping them feel confident and ready for the next stage in their educational journey.

In addition, we are excited to announce that preparations for the Year 6 Production are underway! The children will be working hard to put on a spectacular performance for the whole school and our parent community in July. More details will be shared soon—watch this space!




