They have designed and built obstacle courses, planted and cared for flowers and vegetables in the garden, made biscuits and fruit salad and begun their journeys as confident mathematicians. Reading and writing is an important part of our daily routine, and the children embrace this challenge with enthusiasm.

Starfish

What a fantastic year we have had in Starfish Class! We've made new friends, worked with new adults and have enjoyed exploring and investigating, as well as accessing some more formal learning too. We have started to read chapter books and have learnt and written our own stories. We've thoroughly enjoyed a range of activities this year, from clay modelling hedgehogs to Easter baking with Mrs Venn, singing and dancing for our Nativity performance, yoga sessions in the Hall and who could forget our brilliant trip to The Bristol Zoo Project. We have had so much fun together and have made memories I am sure will never be forgotten.

Dolphin

Dolphins have had a fantastic year! In Maths we have worked on securing our knowledge of math problems using 3-dgit numbers, fractions and decimals, and shape. In English we have enjoyed studying a variety of texts, with writing outcome including poetry, narrative and instruction texts. Most recently we have written our own fables! We have done Art projects around pattern and display. In Opening Worlds we have learnt lots about the origins of Christianity and Islam in History and RE, as well as exploring our wider world in Geography. In Computing we have practised and honed our programming skills, and in Music we have learnt how to play the recorder. We have particularly enjoyed DT which has allowed use to build our own instruments out of recycled materials, bake biscuits and sew our own needle holders! Perhaps the biggest highlight of our year was our school trip to We The Curious. We immensely enjoyed our ability to put our scientific enquiry skills to work at the museum, and have continued to use this knowledge as we built working electrical circuits in class this term!!

Last year over 2500 children took part in North Somerset, and we want to reach even more this year. We are also inviting pre-schoolers to take part this year, with a special mini challenge.



This year's Summer Reading Challenge features artwork from award-winning illustrator Dapo Adeola, whose stunning illustrations will bring the Story Garden theme to life; creating an enchanting world where children can find magical creatures, plants and flowers to inspire their next reading adventure.

Recent research shows that children's enjoyment and engagement in reading is in decline, despite research from the OECD showing that reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more important than either parents' educational background or household income. The Summer Reading Challenge supports children to get excited about reading throughout the summer, helping to maintain their reading at a time when engagement can often dip.

- Children can sign up in North Somerset Libraries from Saturday 5 July
- If they read any 6 library books of their choice, they will collect a sticker per book for their challenge folder.
- If they complete the challenge by Saturday 13 September, they will receive a certificate and medal while stocks last.
