# School Uniform Policy

# 1. Rationale

We are very proud of our school uniform and believe that it is important for children to have a level playing field during the school day and not feel any pressures to wear the latest fashion or expensive brand of trainer. We believe that wearing school uniform has a positive effect on improving children's attitudes to classroom and general school behaviour. It also creates a collective and individual pride in children and their identification with the school and fosters a feeling of belonging. Our school uniform also provides safety and security for both individuals and groups. This policy has been developed in accordance with guidance from Department for Education.

# 2. Uniform

- School logo items are optional and are available from our supplier as detailed on the school website <u>www.banwellprimary.co.uk</u>
- Dark green sweatshirt/jumper/cardigan
- White shirt/blouse/polo shirt
- Grey or black trousers/shorts/skirt pinafore, green striped/checked(gingham) optional summer dress
- Dark shade or white socks or black/grey/dark green tights (not leggings)
- Suitable black footwear, no high heels or shoes without backs.
- Boots are suitable in extremes of weather e.g. snow/ice/very wet
- Please ensure items are labelled.
- Green (preferably) or plain coloured cap for Summer with or without school logo

#### 2.1 PE Kit

- White T-shirt plain or school logo
- Green or black shorts/tracksuit bottoms
- Daps, trainers are permitted in Years 5 and 6
- Swimming: Close fitting swimwear, swim cap and towel. Items should be carried in a named waterproof bag, a comb is recommended.
- PE kit should be worn to school on PE days
- House colour plain T-shirt should be worn for Sports Day

#### 3. Expectations

- It is essential that all children bring a coat to school for outside play.
- It is expected that school uniform will be worn daily (other than specified non-uniform days)
- All clothing and bags should be clearly marked with your child's name
- Children in EYFS-Y2 are encouraged to have a book bag. The PTA provide a free book bag to all children starting in reception.



- All children should bring a water bottle to school, the bottle should be labelled with your child's name.
- PE kit should be worn to school on class PE days as published on the class page of the school website.
- The school will provide a main supplier for the uniform and this can be signposted from the school website.
- Children are not allowed to wear make-up, false nails or nail extensions. Pupils wearing make-up/nails will be required to remove it or where appropriate parents will be contacted.
- Hairstyles should be appropriate to the learning environment. Hair longer than shoulder length should be tied back. Large, excessive hair accessories should not be worn.
- Children are not permitted to wear jewellery to school with the exception of:
  - Simple ear-ring studs in pierced ears, these should be removed for PE, games or swimming. Recently pierced ears will need to be covered with micropore tape for these lessons)
  - A watch may be worn. SMART watches are not permitted.

# 4. Our school's legal duties under Equality Act 2010

The <u>Equality Act 2010</u> prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics which include, race, disability, religion or belief and sex.

To avoid discrimination our school will:

- Avoid listing uniforms based on sex to give pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in.
- Ensure our uniform costs the same for all pupils.
- Recognise that pupil's hair is personal to them and allow them to style their hair in a way that is appropriate for the learning environment but allows them to feel most comfortable.
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents or carers to contact the headteacher who can respond to any request.

# 5. Limiting the cost of school uniform

We are mindful of the cost of schools uniforms and therefore we will:

- Limit the number of items with distinctive characteristics.
- Ensure school branded items are not a compulsory requirement of the school uniform.
- Ensure all uniform items are affordable for all current and future pupils.

- Ensure that uniform items are readily available at a reasonable cost from local shops and supermarkets.
